

- What:** Maturity credits may be awarded to students who are registered at one of our Alternate Education and Training Centres (AETC), up to a maximum of 12 credits. Students must take a minimum of four credits to receive maturity credits.
- Who:** Students who entered grade 9 prior to September, 1999, may qualify for maturity credits.
- Why:** In some cases, a student may only be required to take four courses to graduate, due to the awarding of maturity credits.
- Where:** Every Alternate Education and Training Centre.
- When:** All year long.
- How:** An administrator at your local AETC will meet with you to determine if you qualify for maturity credits. An up-to-date resume along with proof of any form of education that you have been involved in since leaving high school is beneficial. You can also visit us at anewstart.ca
